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Eight high schools go head to head this week in a four-day debating contest called “Let’s Talk” that starts at the Luthuli Museum on March 8 and ends on March 11.

It is the first time that the annual debating competition will be held over four days and the first time that the competition will include eight different high schools from the North Coast area.

Learners will pit their skills against debating teams from other schools including Shakaskraal Secondary, Glenhills High and Stanger High – some who have never before taken part. The topic under discussion will be: “Women have achieved as much and have similarly contributed to the Liberation Movement, to the same extent as leaders such as Chief Albert Luthuli.”

Participating schools stand to win book prizes, vouchers and trophies. The judges include history department at the University of KwaZulu-Natal Jabulani Sithole and Ela Gandhi granddaughter of the late Mahatma Gandhi.
