University of KwaZulu-Natal's Flatfoot Dance Company to perform children's dance musical at Luthuli Museum

School children from all over the North Coast will come together to watch a wonderful musical dance production performed by the acclaimed Flatfoot Dance Company at the Luthuli Museum on September 21 in recognition of the International Day of Peace.

The production is based on the story 'Khetiwa Queen of Imbria' written by acclaimed South African story teller and author Gcina Mhlope.

In 2002 the United Nations General Assembly declared September 21 as an International Day of Peace to get individuals, organizations and nations to dedicate the day to create practical acts of peace.

In 1961, Chief Albert Luthuli became the first African to receive the Nobel Peace Prize in Oslo, Norway. He became an international symbol of peace for his efforts in trying to find a non-violent solution to apartheid.

This year the Luthuli Museum is commemorating the 50th anniversary of Chief Luthuli and his wife Nokukhanya Luthuli's journey to Oslo to receive the award.
