He later joined a school choir and led an Isicathamiya group.

Today, Njinji is a lecturer and musician, keen to share his love of music with others. In his career, he has shared a stage with Khaya Mahlangu, Salim Washington, the Umkhubulwano Jazz Ensemble, and MXO, to name a few. His own compositions, which are presented under the stage name Njinji Street, are inspired by local musicians Bheki Mseleku, Oscar Peterson, Nduduzo Makhatini, and Thandi Ntuli.
